Don't Get Scammed!

You've worked hard to earn, manage and save your money. The last thing you want is for someone to steal it.

Debt Relief Scams

Debt can feel crushing at times, and the promise of quick and easy relief might seem too good to be true. That's because it usually is.

Companies will call or e-mail or may even have a website promising to get you out of debt. Some will take your money, never to be heard from again. Some will ask for a monthly payment and tell you they are paying your debt, but in reality, they are pocketing your money.

Scams like these are cruel, because they are meant to play on your already raw emotions.

What You Should Know:

- There's no guarantee that anyone will get you out of debt or stop collection calls
- Offers to enroll in a debt relief plan that does not review your financial situation is bogus
- Debt relief companies cannot legally seek payment upfront before providing services
- Do not stop paying your creditors, and ask for proof if a debt relief company claims its fees are paying your debt.

Scammers are real and we want to help protect you from them. A few rules of thumb to help avoid scams are:

- Avoid wiring money to someone you don't know in real life. If a person you started chatting online with
 a few weeks ago needs \$2,000 wired to him, it's time to stop chatting.
- Be cautious of anyone who asks to be paid in a non-traditional way, like gift cards or wire transfer, for items or services.
- Don't share personal passwords or PINs with anyone, and report anyone who asks you for them.
- Check the email handle. Some scammers can copy the look and feel of official emails, but they can't fake a protected company email address.
- If something feels off, there's a good chance it is.

You can always call us or come into one of our branches if you have any concerns that someone is trying to scam you.
